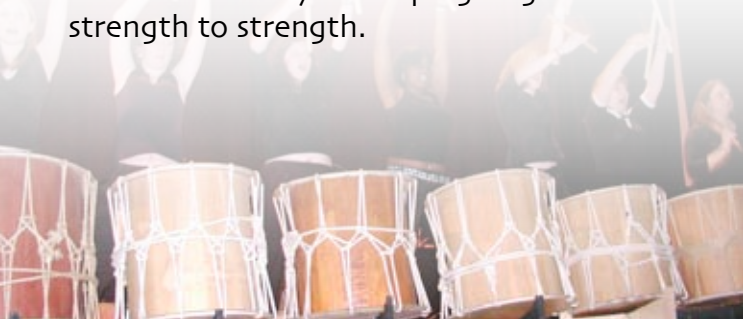

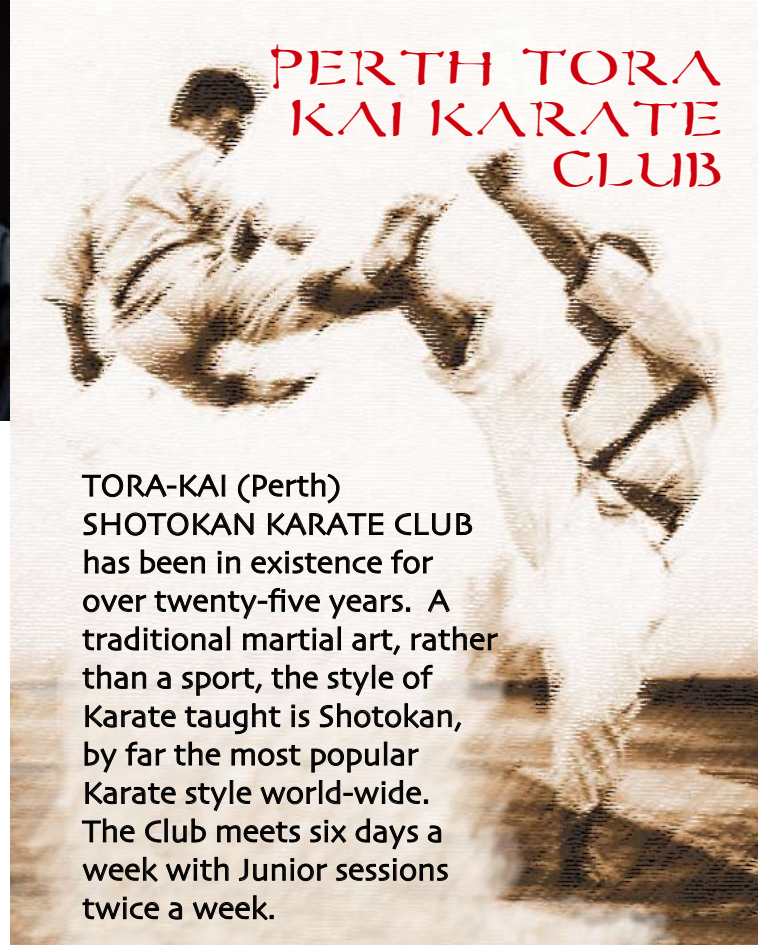
the authenticity of the Japanorama event with an insight into the Traditional Tea Ceremony, Calligraphy, Origami and the Japanese Fan Dance.
